JOIN US AT OUR OPENING CHAPEL SERVICE

Our opening chapel service will be Monday, August 25th at 8:30am, and you are welcome to join us! Our regular chapel time will resume the next week on Friday, September 5th at 8:15am. This year all students (PS-8th grade) will join together for chapel each week!

CARLINE PROCEDURES FOR NEW & RETURNING FAMILIES

Are you new to St. John's and wondering how carline will go each afternoon? Are you a returning family and just need a reminder? Well wonder no more!

Each afternoon, PS-8th grade parents picking up their children via carline begin arriving between 2:00-3:00pm. Here's what to do next.

- Enter the STJ parking lot from the Mystique Dr. entrance.
- Proceed to the end of the far parking spaces (see top picture).
 - Cars will form multiple lines perpendicular to the parking spaces.
- Wait for an STJ staff member to signal the start of carline and then line by line, slowly drive up to the building curb.
 - Show your family sign to the staff member as you pass him/her so that your child can be summoned from the gym
- Once at the curb, park as far up as possible (see bottom picture) and place your family sign in the passenger-side window for staff to see.
 - Be sure to avoid the crosswalk.
 - Typically, 4-5 cars can fit along the curb.
- Children will enter vehicles from the curb.

 For those parents needing to assist their child with safety harnesses, please have your child sit down in his/her seat and then proceed to a parking space to assist him or her.
 Do not assist while parked at the curb.





WATER TESTING RESULTS

This summer, St. John's drinking water was tested for lead contamination in accordance with MN health and safety guidelines. Results of this testing show that no remediation is needed. Parents may request a copy of these results by contacting Tori Kuehne at Tori.Kuehne@stjlutheran.org.

ESP INFO & SCHEDULING

ESP is provided each school day from 3-5:30pm; the cost is \$10/day per child.

To pick your child up from ESP, you must park in the small, back lot (look for the road between the school and the home next door). Buzz in at door 7 and go directly to the ESP room (take the first left upon entering through door 7 and then the first door on the left) to sign your child out. This will require a PIN, which was given to you at Back-to-School Night (included with your family car sign). Returning families, your PINs will remain the same as before. ESP staff will be available to assist you, if needed.

You must schedule your child in advance to utilize ESP services. Children not scheduled are not guaranteed a space in ESP.





Option 1

Experiment Using the Scientific Method Grades 2-8

Do a scientific experiment at home using the steps of the Scientific Method. Communicate results on a tri-fold display board. Prepare a presentation that explains and displays your experiment. Students in grades 5-8 will also have to write a report on their science topic according to teacher guidelines. You may also display items from your experiment on the table with your tri-fold board.

- Ask a Big Question
- Make a guess or a hypothesis
- Conduct research (5-8)
- Plan out your experiment
- Collect Data; use graphs, tables, photos
- Communicate your results on your tri-fold board
- Grades 5-8 need to write a report
- Be prepared to share your results with a short prepared presentation





Design and Implement an Engineering
Plan
Grades 2-8

Identify a need in our community. Design an invention at home to solve that problem. Follow the design process for engineers. Communicate results on a trifold display board. Students in grades 5-8 will also be required to write a report on their science topic, following teacher guidelines. You may also display items from your invention on the table with your trifold board.

- Define the Problem
- Do Background Research
- Make a Plan
- Specify Requirements
- Brainstorm Solutions
- Choose the Best Solution
- Do Development Work
- Build a Prototype
- Test and Redesign
- Communicate your results on your trifold board
- Grades 5-8 need to write a report
- Be prepared to share your results with a short prepared presentation

Option 3 - 2nd - 4th Grade Only

Demonstration Grades 2-4 Only

Students in grades 2-4 may choose to do a demonstration at home of some kind of science concept. A trifold display board is still needed to share information regarding the demonstration. The display board must include a title, a procedure, graphics, and information regarding the topic of the demonstration. This group of projects will also require students to communicate their results.

- How did you become interested in the topic of the demonstration?
- What question did you ask yourself?
- How does your project work?
- What are you demonstrating?
- List of materials needed/used
- What you learned
