MAPping Our Progress

At St. John's, we believe deeply in nurturing each child's growth — spiritually, socially, and academically. One tool that helps us understand how that growth is going is standardized testing. I want to share with you why these tests are important, what the latest national and state data show, and how you can help your child do their very best when our MAP testing begins next week.

Standardized tests are sometimes misunderstood. They are not the only measure of a student's abilities, but they serve several important purposes. These tests give us insights into what your child has learned and where there might be gaps. We can see their strengths and areas needing more support, even in specific skills (like reading comprehension, math reasoning, vocabulary, etc.). That helps us tailor instruction, interventions, and support to meet your child where he/she is. In addition, by comparing how students generally are doing in the same grade across subjects, we can ensure our classroom pacing, curriculum, and teaching practices are effective. If most students are struggling with a concept, we can adjust instruction. Standardized testing also helps us to see how our students are performing compared to peers across the state or nation. This gives us perspective on whether what we're doing is working well or if there are broader educational trends we need to address.

Recently, results from the 2024 National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP), also known as The Nation's Report Card, have been making the news. Both the NAEP scores and Minnesota's state assessments (MCA) show that between 31-55% of students are meeting or exceeding proficiency in math and reading. I am happy to report that St. John's well exceeds these numbers. Each year, we assess our K-8 students in the fall and spring with MAP (Measures of Academic Progress), a nationally-normed assessment. Over the past three years, over 80% of our students have scored at proficient or above

in math, 82% have scored proficient or above in reading, and over 88% have scored proficient or above in language usage. Our numbers have also been on an upward trend with our highest scores last year.

Next week, all students in kindergarten through 8th grade will take the MAP assessments. This is a time for each child to show what they know and what they still need to work on. You can help make it a positive, productive experience in several ways:

- Ensure your child gets a good night's sleep
- Provide a healthy breakfast
- Talk about the test positively this is about growth and learning
- Make sure students arrive on time
- Encourage your child's effort the test adapts to each student, so it's okay for them to find parts challenging

Standardized testing isn't everything — and we never let a test define a child. But when used well, it gives us a clearer picture: how each child is doing, how our classrooms are performing, and how our school stands in relation to broader trends. Together, with your support, we can use these data points to grow stronger, close gaps, and ensure that every student is flourishing.

Thank you for partnering with us. We are grateful for your trust as we guide your child in both faith and knowledge.
