Classic Bible Memory for Primary Grades

3rd gr.+ **Romans 8:28-** We know that all things work together for good
To those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose.

Psalm 145:15-16- The eyes of all look to You, [O Lord,]
and You give them their food at the proper time.
You open Your hand and satisfy the desires of every living thing.

The Small Catechism: The Lord's Prayer

PreK+ *The Third Petition:* Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

1st gr+ *What does this mean?*
The good and gracious will of God is done even without our prayer,
But we pray in this petition that it may be done among us also.

3rd gr+ *How is God's will done?*
God's will is done when He breaks and hinders every evil plan and purpose
Of the devil, the world, and our sinful nature,
Which do not want us to hallow God's name or let His kingdom come;
And when He strengthens and keeps us firm in His Word and faith until we die.
This is His good and gracious will.

PreK+ *The Fourth Petition:* Give us this day our daily bread.

1st gr+ *What does this mean?*
God certainly gives daily bread to everyone without our prayers, even to all evil people,
But we pray in this petition that God would lead us to realize this
And to receive our daily bread with thanksgiving.

2nd gr+ *What is meant by daily bread?*
Daily bread includes everything that has to do with the support and needs of the body,
Such as food, drink, clothing, shoes, house, home,
Land, animals, money, goods,
A devout husband or wife, devout children,
Devout workers, devout and faithful rulers,
Good government, good weather, peace, health, self-control,
Good reputation, good friends, faithful neighbors, and the like.

Catechism Bible Verse

3rd gr+ **1 Timothy 6:8a, 10a-** But if we have food and clothing, with these we will be content...
For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evils.

Pray - the Lord's Prayer, Luther's morning or evening prayers, and the topical prayers for the day of the week

Sing a hymn - use one of the hymns from the past Sunday, the coming Sunday, or the school year
